


CALL WHEN YOU ARRIVE & WE WILL **ITEMS TO YOU**

Your library system is here for you! Providing vital library services during a pandemic has allowed us to create new opportunities for service. During the time the library had to close, we were still open virtually and offered enhanced electronic materials, more access to streaming titles for movies and music, online library card sign up, and virtual storytimes and crafts.

When we were able to re-open in June, the influx of patrons into the buildings with their cheers of "Thank you! We've missed you!" really drove home the love people have for their libraries. Our buildings are open for you to come in (at least when this was written!) and pick up your favorite reading material, or to call us and pick up your items curbside. From home, you can continue to access downloadable or streaming materials such as movies, music, e-books, and audiobooks, and we're still increasing our selection of electronic materials.

Programming, for the time being, is still virtual with storytimes, crafts, virtual field trips, and local experts sharing their knowledge - something for everyone. We've also added a "chat" feature on our website (see right) to offer yet another way to get your questions answered.

Whether at home, on the Bookmobile, or in the physical building, your library continues to provide essential services throughout the county.




