
## Expand your digital library collection! Check out more books through Partner Libraries on the Libby app — for free!


**Step 1:** Have your BCLS library card number and PIN handy.

**Step 2:** Go to the Libby app on your mobile device (new cards will not save to your account if you do this on a desktop computer).


**Step 3:** Tap the center Menu button and then scroll down and tap "Add Library."




**Step 4:** Start typing the name of the partner library you would like to add, then select it from the list.




Step 5: Select "Sign In With My Card."



**Step 6:** Select BCLS from the Partner Libraries list.



**Step 7:** Enter your BCLS library card number and PIN. Now you are signed in and can check out items and place holds from this partner library's Libby collection!




Repeat steps 1-7 for each partner library card you would like to add to your Libby account. Please note that each library will have to be added separately. Make sure you do this on the Libby app of the mobile device you use most often for library digital collections.
